


Key features

- b) Using Indigenous Governance: Adapting planning process structure to suit local context
- c) Flexible time & regular feedback: Not rushing the planning process & being flexible with dates
- d) Using appropriate terms & language: Like all planning systems, OS language has specific language that can be adapted to suit the context







































































How does it happen?
