

Sahtu Renewable Resources Board
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Project Funding Application Guidelines

For APRIL 1, 2005 – MARCH 31, 2006

In accordance with the 1993 Sahtu Dene and Metis Comprehensive Land Claim Agreement, the Sahtu Renewable Resources Board (SRRB) has funds available to support research associated with management of renewable resources in the Sahtu Settlement Area (SSA). Researchers interested in applying for funds from the SRRB should complete an **Application for Renewable Resource Project Funding** and send it to the Executive Director, SRRB, at the above address **by January 15, 2005** (earlier is better). Applications for funding will be reviewed by the SRRB early in the new year, and applicants will be notified by the 15th of March 2005, concerning their applications. **Later applications will not be accepted.**

The SRRB is primarily concerned with management of wildlife, fisheries, forestry and other renewable resources of value to claimants and non-claimants in the SSA. Projects must deal with renewable resources in the SSA and proponents must have begun the consultation process with the community Renewable Resources Councils in order to be considered for funding. Priority will be given to projects that have management value in the SSA and technical merit. Preference will also be given to those projects for which costs are shared with other agencies and to projects that directly involve beneficiaries from Sahtu communities.

Prospective applicants are advised that research undertaken in the Northwest Territories requires (a) a government permit or license, and (b) consultation with Renewable Resources Council(s) (RRCs) of communities in the area of the proposed work. For example, for wildlife research, signed approval from the head of the relevant RRC(s) is required before a wildlife research permit will be issued by the Department of Resources, Wildlife and Economic Development (DRWED) of the Government of the Northwest Territories. Addresses for the five RRCs in the Sahtu and the DRWED are appended to this guide. Permits and approval from the RRC(s) do not have to be in place when applying for funding to the SRRB, although consultation must have begun with the relevant RRC. Studies already supported by RRCs are likely to be favored by the SRRB. Applicants are encouraged to contact SRRB staff to discuss research proposals before submitting a formal proposal and to continue to have dialogue with the staff during the application process. SRRB staff can help develop proposals and advise on community consultation, but applicants should begin their enquiries early. A general guide to permits, licenses and research procedures in the western Northwest Territories can be obtained from the Aurora Research Institute in Inuvik, NT (address appended).

Applicants should also be aware that portions of the Sahtu Settlement Area are reserved as Sahtu lands under the 1993 Land Claim Agreement and that Sahtu participants have special rights in these areas. Access to these lands requires permission from the District Land Corporation (addresses appended). Maps showing these claimed lands can be obtained from the Sahtu Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Project (contact (867) 587-2740, fax (867) 587-2359). If the intended research is to take place on Sahtu lands, the applicant must show proof of permission to the SRRB.

The SRRB may fund multi-year studies, with annual funds made available upon receipt of satisfactory annual progress reports and financial statements. Researchers applying for one-year studies and for the first year of a multi-year study should complete an application as described below. Researchers applying for continuing funding for a previously approved project should provide (a) a comprehensive annual report, (b) a financial statement for the previous year, and (c) a budget for the next year of funding. All applicants should clearly indicate total project costs, other sources of funding, and the portion of funds requested from SRRB. Applicants must also report research results to RRCs in an appropriate format. SRRB staff can advise on suitable formats.

Results of research projects funded by the SRRB may be published at the discretion of the researchers. However, SRRB does require that copies of any publication, reports or theses resulting from SRRB-funded work be provided to SRRB in a timely manner, and that SRRB support be acknowledged.

A specific application form is not provided; applicants are asked to write their applications following the sequence of headings that follow. Where headings are not applicable, please write n/a, with a brief explanation. The project name should be written at the top of each page. Applicants are encouraged to be clear and concise, but to provide all necessary details. Non-scientists as well as scientists will review applications, so researchers are asked to use non-technical language wherever possible. Applications may also be reviewed by outside reviewers. Applications should not normally exceed 5-6 pages.

Notes on individual items in application

1. **Applicant Names & Affiliations:** List names, addresses, phone/fax numbers and e-mail.
2. **Summary:** Give an overview (one page or less) summarizing project background, objectives, methods and budget. Please use **non-technical** language.
3. **Background & Objectives:** Outline the background and reasons for the study, including management implications, related studies and experience of the applicant(s) in the relevant field. List study objectives clearly.
4. **Methods:** Describe the proposed research methods, including: (a) field techniques, (b) analytical methods, (c) field staff, including any opportunities for local involvement, (d) timing of field studies, and (e) location(s) of expected work. Include a map where appropriate. Where animal handling is involved, describe provisions for proper animal care. Applicants should be aware that handling of wildlife is a very sensitive issue in Sahtu communities.
5. **Traditional Knowledge:** Indicate the role that traditional knowledge will play in this project, and how this information will be gathered.
6. **Budget:** Give a detailed breakdown of project costs for each year of the study, using the following headings as a guide (Travel, Accommodation, Wages, Field Equipment, Field Maintenance (food, fuel, etc.), Secretarial/Administrative, Air Charters). Where funding is sought for more than one source, indicate clearly the total funds applied for and the proportion requested from SRRB.
7. **Reporting of Results:** Describe how the results will be reported, including any popular or technical formats.
8. **Community Consultation:** Describe existing or planned methods of consulting with Renewable Resources Councils before and after the planned research.
9. **Permits & Licenses:** Indicate any relevant permits or licenses that have been or will be applied for.
