Presentation by Deborah Simmons

- The Board is focused for this meeting on decisions and reasons for decision related to the BNE Hearing proceeding; other issues will be included in a "Parking Lot" list for future discussion.

Other Hearing Updates

Presentations by Deborah Simmons and Lorraine Land

Wek'èezhìi Renewable Resources Board BNE Hearing

- The WRRB has issued the first part of its report on their hearing.
- The Tł₂cho Government and ENR proposal provided for a 950 TAH, with 39% TG and 46% Nunavut and 14% Sahtú (163 animals).
- WRRB determination is that the TAH should be 750 because they believe that the population status
 and trends, based on demographic indicators and environmental conditions. If Sahtú gets 17% of
 750, this would reduce the harvest to 127 animals. Although this is identified as a determination in
 the report, it is effectively a recommendation to the Minister. The TG and GNWT can accept, vary or
 reject the decision.
- They are of the opinion that no harvest is sustainable.
- The SRRB's process is different in that the Minister must review in 60 days and provide written reasons for any decision to vary or replace the decision; the Board reviews the Minister's decision and responds if they wish before the decision is made.
- TG has requested an extension on their response to the report.
- A lot of details in the report about the process, so it may not be necessary to repeat in the SRRB report.

Nunavut Wildlife Management Board Hearing

Presentation by Lorraine Land

The Kugluktuk Hunters and Trappers Organisation in collaboration with the Kitikmeot Inuit Association developed a first iteration on a community caribou plan for consideration by the NWMB. The following key features of the plan are as follows:

- "Transfer of harvest control to Government of Nunavut is a 'last resort'
- Limit on member harvest (340 maximum, harvested 190 in 2015-2016 with no harvest limit)
- Mandatory reporting
- "No hunting zones" (closest to the community and in calving grounds)
- HTO enforcement of: 1) harvest level; 2) reporting, 3) zones; better success in achieving goal
- Predator management
- Education program
- Increased muskox harvest quota
