Role of Special Advisors

Presentation by Deborah Simmons

- Special Advisors have normally been individuals who are former SRRB Board members or have been nominated to be Board members.
- In July, the SRRB formally approved a motion to invite ?ehdzo Got'ine Presidents or their designate to participate in the Board as Special Advisors.
- Special Advisors participate in all SRRB Board meetings, and provide advice for wise decisions; however, they do not make motions or vote.
- Like regular Board members, they participate as part of the Board to implement the mandate and objectives of the Board; they do not represent the nominating party (in this case, ?ehdzo Got'ine).
- The Board is responsible to report to ?ehdzo Got'ine as they see fit.
- Funds for Special Advisors comes from the Core Board budget.
- The role of Special Advisors will be added as a component of the SRRB's Operating Guideline.

Nááts' Ihch' oh National Park Reserve presentation – Ecological Integrity Monitoring Program

Presentation by Faye D'Eon-Eggertson

- This presentation follows directly from the SRRB's comment on the draft Management Plan, requesting more information about NNPR's Ecological Integrity Monitoring Program.
- There are five key things being monitored in the park: birds, fish, plants, water, bats.
- Park staff are experimenting with approaches to achieving quality monitoring results.
- Opportunities for community engagement: participation in the Board, visits to the park, involvement in traditional knowledge study, and employment as staff.
- Traditional knowledge research has been led by Leon Modeste in Tulít'a, and there has also been research with Norman Wells; the focus has been on placenames, and a little bit on wildlife.

ACCWM Bluenose West and Bluenose East status assessment approval

Bluenose East and Bluenose West status assessment

- The ACCWM is composed of Wildlife Management Authorities: Gwich'in Renewable Resources Board, the Tuktut Nogait National Park Management Board, the Wek'eezhii Renewable Resources Board, the Sahtu Renewable Resources Board, the Wildlife Management Advisory Council-NWT, the Kitikmeot Regional Wildlife Board (KRWB), and the NWMB.
- The ACCWM recommended that Member Boards assess all three herds at the same status as last year, as a precautionary measure pending new evidence that the status is changing.

Proposed Species At Risk Listings

Presentations by Deborah Simmons and Leon Andrew

?ekwé or ?eda (Barren-Ground Caribou)

- The NWT Conference of Management Authorities on Species At Risk (CMA) will be seeking a consensus decision on the status of zekwé/zedə at their meeting in February. The NWT Species At Risk Committee (SARC) has issued a status assessment report with the recommendation that zekwé/zedə be designated as Łólak'óono xae kúhyə wíleade gha sóoni (Tulít'a/Délinę) or Líla horéno xai egúhyó behúle rágudi (K'áhsho Got'ine), Threatened (might disappear in 100 years).
- The Committee on the Status of Endangered Species in Canada (COSEWIC) has recommended that all barren-ground caribou in Canada be given this designation. Consultation will take place in preparation for a fall 2018 decision.

Fisheries and Oceans Canada and the Canadian Wildlife Service are both required to consult on the status of Sahba or béré (Bull Trout). Based on status assessments, it has been recommended that this species be designated Bek'e k'énadets'ewə (Tulít'a/Délinę)or bek'e k'ínarədıts'ewe gha got'ódéra (K'áhsho Got'inę), Special Concern (we have to keep an eye on it).
