- Fort Good Hope is waiting for Colville Lake to create a conservation plan for caribou (because they are the main harvesters of caribou); however, Fort Good Hope may create a conservation plan for Dene foods in general they have expressed interested in this possibility.

- At the recent Wildlife Act Section 15 meeting attended by Jeffery Walker and Norman Barichello on behalf of Colville, everyone was concerned with harvest reporting and believes that not enough is being done. There was lots of talk about developing a territorial standard.

4. Species At Risk

Presentation by Colin Macdonald

Red-necked Phalarope

- Jimmy Dillon: I used to see lots of these birds here around Willow Lake, but don't see many anymore.
- Frederick Andrew: I used to see many more and maybe they moved because of food sources. There is a need for studies about songbirds that are disappearing.
- Note that the SRRB is working with Erin Bayne, University of Alberta, to pursue a funding proposal with the Aboriginal Fund for Species At Risk (AFSAR) to support research on songbirds, including questions about forest fire impacts.
- General concern about declining species diversity globally.
