5. Business Arising from Minutes

- a) Traditional Knowledge Pilot Study
 - Final Report & Brochure, entitled "Dene Ways of Respecting the Land and Animals" tabled
 - Deline chosen for pilot study b/c trained researchers available through Deline Uranium Team process; opportunities for other communities to complete similar study
 - Developed to incorporate Dene laws and values into a comprehensive traditional knowledge policy
 - Concerns to be addressed by policy: intellectual property rights & ownership, traditional knowledge usage (what provided and how used), storage of traditional knowledge

ACTION (**Chair & ED**): To develop draft comprehensive traditional knowledge policy for incorporation into Policy & Procedure Manual

b) Regional Engagement Initiative

- DIAND program established to improve their current engagement and consultation practices across the country; trying to rebuild relationships/trust
- Forward report to Board members to illicit comments
- Fuel spill at Hanna Creek (2005); to date, no one has been held responsible; no meeting in Fort Good Hope w/ any agencies

ACTION (ED): To forward concerns re: Hanna Creek spill, comments re: initiative, and request more DIAND presence/reporting at SRRB meetings to Robert Overvold

ACTION (RRCO & Keith Hickling): To ensure communities know what responsibilities each government agency has and how to contact them

c) Pipeline EA Report

- Final Report, entitled "Key Harvesting Issues Pertaining to the Proposed Mackenzie Gas Project" tabled
- SRRB is registered intervener in both the Joint Review Panel and National Energy Board processes; report will be forwarded as written evidence for Hearings
- Report focuses on potential impacts to harvesters and harvesting practices in the Sahtu now and in the future
- SRRB will be hiring an Environmental Assessment Specialist to specifically handle all responses to land use permits, water licences, wildlife research permits and scientific licences

6. Agency Update – CWS, Paul Latour

- PowerPoint Presentation, entitled "Ecological Inventory of the Ts'ude'hliline-Tuyetah Candidate Protected Area" tabled
- Fieldwork completed June 2005 w/ community monitor, Lawrence Caesar; additional fieldwork planned for June 2006; no winter work planned
- Community request for land withdrawal to be made soon; the community of Fort Good Hope and partners will be working towards possibly protecting the area as a National Wildlife Area under the Canada Wildlife Act

7. Agency Update – ENR, Steve Hannah & Keith Hickling

- PowerPoint Presentation, entitled "RWED Restructuring" and Forest Management Division Report tabled
- Brief overview given of the switch into two new departments Environment & Natural Resources and Industry, Tourism & Investments
- Only three (3) fires actively fought in 2005 fire season; only areas identified as high Valued Ecosystem Components (VEC) are fought (this does not include critical caribou habitat)
- Concerns about grubstake program can be changed with recommendations from local RRCs and trappers; furs can be sold directly to Western Canadian in Vancouver; Sahtu furs saw top dollar at North Bay Auction during 2004/05 (\$110 marten; \$75 lynx; \$40 fox)
- No wildlife officers available to monitor winter road during 2004/05 season; cabin at Porcupine River to be used as check station along winter road in the future
- Following the completion of Species at Risk legislation, work will begin on the Wildlife Act

8. Agency Update – DFO, Larry Dow

- Progress Report, entitled "2005/06 Projects for the SRRB George Low" tabled
- Collecting salmon or bull trout caught in the Sahtu; paying \$50/ fish; send fish frozen to Hay River
- Fishery regulations are being separated from Nunavut; recommendations for change can be made, e.g. reduce/eliminate sport harvest; plans for additional officers in the field
- Special exploratory licence can be obtained to serve fish at Grey Bear Lodge (support letters from RRC & SRRB required); fishing still must be outside Special Harvesting Area

12. Bluenose Caribou Herd (East & West) Census Results - Alasdair Veitch

- PowerPoint Presentation, entitled "Census Results for Cape Bathurst, Bluenose-West, and Bluenose-East Barren-ground Caribou Herds, July 2005", Meeting Minutes (31 August 2005 & 09 September 2005), Bluenose Caribou Herds Survey Results Summary, Bluenose Caribou Herds Fact Sheet, Barren-ground Caribou Harvest Statistics 1998-2003, Graph of North American Caribou Population Trends and "Caribou Co-Management: An Overview" tabled
- In 1998, 4 out of every 10 caribou harvested was a cow; in 2003, 7 out of 10 caribou harvested was a cow
- Harvest Study accuracy confident that harvest data provided were collected and recorded accurately by Aboriginal Community Interviewers and Harvest Study Coordinator; challenges include: census data collection incomplete (not all beneficiaries participated in Study), possible under/over reporting, recall period too long, interviewee fatigue, no data collected for resident Aboriginals
- Plans to repeat census in July 2006 with the deployment of additional satellite and VHF collars to increase sample size of collared animals on each herd; collar more bulls
- Wildlife Management Advisory Council (NWT) (WMAC-NWT) recommendations (met 10-11 September 2005): change hunting management zone, eliminate commercial/resident/outfitter harvest within management zone, repeat photo-census in 2006, study winter snow conditions, increase monitoring of herds, and improve harvest data collection
- Need protection for the Bluenose-East calving grounds; less habitat available, including refuge from heat and bugs on the tundra
- No grizzly bear or wolf studies have been conducted in the Sahtu; predator populations are increasing; caribou and predators have always co-existed; need monitoring of contaminants and noise
- RRCs are responsible for ensuring that the photo-census information is distributed in each community; ENR/SRRB staff willing to present information if invited to

- meetings; all Sahtu community, RRC & SRRB recommendations will be combined and forwarded to Minister of ENR; development separate management plans with all communities that harvest the three herds
- Change hunt from winter road season to fall; urge harvesters to take bulls rather than
 cows, especially November to April; reduce total number of caribou take by Sahtu
 harvesters & other First Nations (Dehcho and Tlicho); additional items were noted on
 flipchart (ENR)

- Presentation, entitled "Wildlife Studies Fund September 2005" tabled
- No international component
- Defensive strategy for Fixed Income Class (Bonds) prepared for yields to increase, interest rates to increase, and bonds to decrease; typically Bonds outperform
- Canadian Equity strategy positioned to benefit from strong Canadian economy (weighted to energy sector)
- Benefited from Income Trusts; selection of individual companies make up diversified income trust (mainly oil/gas)
- Defensive strategy for US Equities positioned for strong economy but due to Hurricane Katrina, slower markets in the short term; US market has broader diversification
- Investment in alternative energy sector (socially responsible stocks)? Currently not invested b/c either too volatile or international component
- Suggest: reallocate weight from either Money Market Class or Fixed Income Class to Income Trusts (leave equity classes alone); move 2% into alternative energy portfolio

- Check stations along winter roads (Deline to Tulita & Fort Good Hope to Colville Lake); collect harvest information as well as aid with enforcement; federal funding available through Cumulative Impacts Monitoring Program
- Photo-census repeated in July 2006
- Need to ensure that all communities that harvest from the Bluenose Herds are cooperating (management plans)

- Development densities are a mitigation measure that will limit the impact of future development proposals, protect traditional harvesting needs, and maintain sustainable wildlife populations in the Sahtu Settlement Area

- Fire Management why are fires being allowed to burn instead of suppressing them right away?; 1) fires are very expensive to fight (use values at risk to determine which fires to fight) and 2) fire can be good for creating habitat, i.e., creates good moose habitat
- Fire Suppression Crew should be involved with community beautification during downtime; crews can be used to help community, especially with the Fire Smart Program
- Outfitted Hunting in Mountains what happens to the meat?; meat is brought to communities (once a year to Fort Good Hope); hides should be brought back to communities to provide opportunities for girls to learn how to sew
- Low flying aircraft should be banned during trapping season; if no consultation occurring, immediately report to GNWT and DIAND
- Barge landing site for Mackenzie Gas Project pipeline should be above Rapids at Bluefish Creek (away from community and main fishing area)
